- Continuously assess student progress and adapt instruction accordingly to ensure ongoing improvement.

- Attend and actively participate in orientation, meetings, and debriefing sessions.
- Collaborate with colleagues, assistant teachers, program directors to ensure program success.
- Communicate with parents on an ongoing basis regarding student progress, behavior, and program updates.

• Collaborate with assistant teachers and programs directors in developing, attending, and actively participating in parent/caregiver events.

Professionalism and Teamwork:

- Maintain professionalism by arriving on time, adhering to program policies, and maintaining a clean workspace.
